If you have been arrested, these are your rights:



- You have the right to remain silent
- You have the right to contact your lawyer
- You do not have to sign anything immediately and can wait for your lawyer to review any documents given to you before signing them

Traffic Stops

If you are pulled over by a police officer you must provide them with:



- Your driver's license
- Proof of insurance
- Vehicle registration



An officer may arrest you if you refuse to provide these things

If an officer pulls you over:

- You have to identify yourself to the police
- You are allowed to politely ask them why they pulled you over
- Respond to their requests and questions with "yes, sir/ma'am" or "no, sir/ma'am"
- You are allowed to ask if you are under arrest or if you are being detained. If you are not, you are allowed to ask if you can leave

“On-the-go” Printable Card – Instructions

Instructions for downloading and printing your wallet card from a PDF Viewer:

1. Download the PDF file by clicking on the download button.
2. After the file is downloaded, open the file in your regular PDF viewer.
3. Click on the “File” button at the top file corner of your screen.
4. Scroll down to the “Print” button within the menu. Click on the “Print” button.
5. Check to make sure that your printer is connected to your device. If your printer is connected, print your wallet card.

Instructions for printing from Google Chrome

1. Download the PDF file by clicking on the download button.
2. After the file is downloaded, open the file in your web browser.
3. In the toolbar at the top of your browser, you will see the print button in the top right corner. Click on this button.
4. Check to make sure that your printer is connected to your device. If your printer is connected, print your wallet card.

How to use this card:

1. After printing your card, cut your card out. It is recommended that you print two copies of your card in case you lose one of them.
2. Fill out your card with the name and phone number of your lawyer. Memorize this information just in case you do have access to your card at the time of your arrest.
3. Regularly read and review your rights regularly. Keep this document in your wallet, if you can, so that you can review your rights "on-the-go".
